

Mahoning County Ares Response Card

- 1) At home, work or mobile be observant, know your situation.
- 2) Make sure your family and home are safe / secure.
- 3) Be prepared- Check all your equipment, batteries, etc...
- 4) Monitor ARES designated Repeater/Simplex frequencies
- 5) Monitor local broadcast, NOAA Weather, Public service.
- 6) Participate in "loose" or established net(s) as needed.
- 7) Following check-in await instructions. **"Do Not Self Deploy"**
- 8) If deployed, maintain detailed log with time, traffic info, etc...
- 9) Keep transmissions brief, use tactical call sign & factual, concise, language.
- 10) Notify Net Control if you leave your post.
- 11) ID every 10 minutes per FCC

Primary – W8QLY 146.745 (-) (CTCSS 110.9 Hz) (M.V.A.R.A. Repeater)

1st Backup – W8IZC 146.910 (-) (CTCSS 110.9 Hz) (Wes Repeater)

2nd Backup – K8TKA 147.315 (+) (CTCSS 156.7 Hz) (20/9 Repeater)

If Repeaters are Down

3rd Backup - Simplex 146.745 and/or 146.520
